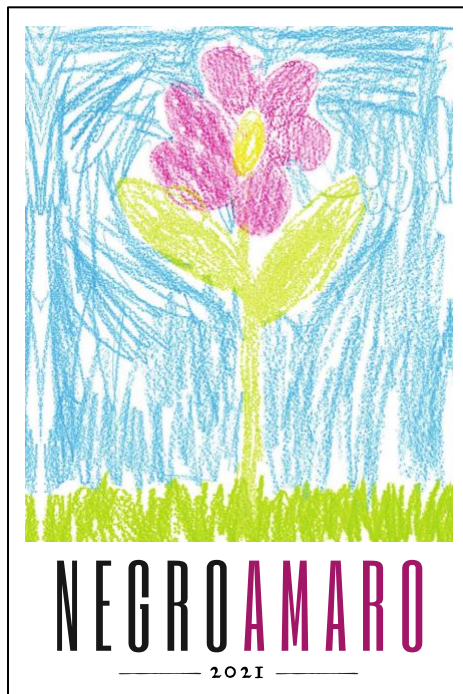


Lewis-Clark Valley 2021

Rosé of Negroamaro

What we can we say about the 2021 growing season, other than it was memorable. Hot, dry, and then hot and dry some more. Not surprisingly growing wine grapes in 2021 was a challenge, considering growing anything that summer was, least to say, discouraging. Harvest commenced at least two weeks ahead of normal and ended by October 1st. Crop yields were roughly 45% below normal – not great for the library but it did allow for quick harvesting to maintain flavors and reasonable sugar levels. This crisp rosé of Negroamaro is built of layers upon layers of flavors. Aromas of melon, peach, nectarine, and bright red raspberry draw you in, while essence of citrus oil and ruby red grapefruit round out the finish to this delightful wine.
